The organ is in a gallery-level case at the rear of the room. Traditional style console with roll top. The console is in a fixed position, center.

Four manuals. 5 divisions. 88 stops. 55 registers. 59 ranks. 4071 pipes. Manual compass is 61 notes. Pedal compass is 32 notes.

Electro-pneumatic (EP) chests.

Drawknobs in vertical rows on angled jambs. Balanced swell shoes/pedals, standard AGO placement. Adjustable combination pistons. AGO Standard (concave radiating) pedalboard. Crescendo Pedal. Combination action thumb pistons. Combination action toe studs. Coupler reversible toe studs.

- 3. It is understood as an essential condition of this contract that Mr. H. E. Tonjes shall personally install and finish this organ, having been invited by the part of the second part to handle this contract.
- It is understood that the French Horn, English Horn and French Trumpet pipes are to be from Gottfried, while the remaining reed stops are to be from either White or Badger. Pitch of organ to be A 440.

- 5. The rear wall of either one of the upper organ chambers to be equipped with a set of at least four swell shades which shall operate from the pedal controlling the front shades of that particular chamber.
- The larger display pipes to be finished in gold. Smaller display pipes of polished metal; console to be finished English brown mahogany, massive and heavy.
